The above is a quotation from the Florida Park Service Volunteer Handbook. The Friends of Delnor-Wiggins Pass State Park is a hard working group of volunteers who dedicate time and talent to our park in support of this mission. You may find us picking up trash on the beach, repairing boardwalks, clearing foliage, raking picnic areas, planting, scrapbooking, and just about anything that can be done to maintain and improve our beautiful park. Every year we get a "wish" list from the park staff. The Board studies the requests and allocates dollar amounts for each item. Then we go about raising money. Our fundraisers include the Art Show, held in January, the Wiggins Pass Nature Festival coming soon on March 19th, and a new one we inaugurated last November, The Green Flash, a Sunset Celebration. We also have a fine recycling program so save your cans for the park!

We offer educational programs and field opportunities for our members. In recent years we have visited Myakka State Park, Gasparilla Island State Park, and Oscar Scherer State Park. Each May, September, and December we have a picnic or dinner when we celebrate the work of our volunteers and give out awards and pins. We also are offered opportunities to attend events at other state parks, often assisting with their fund raisers.

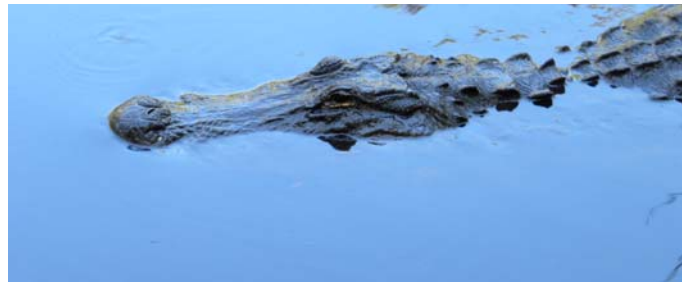

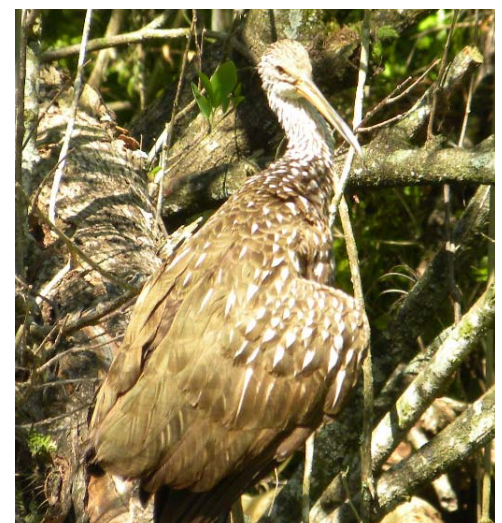


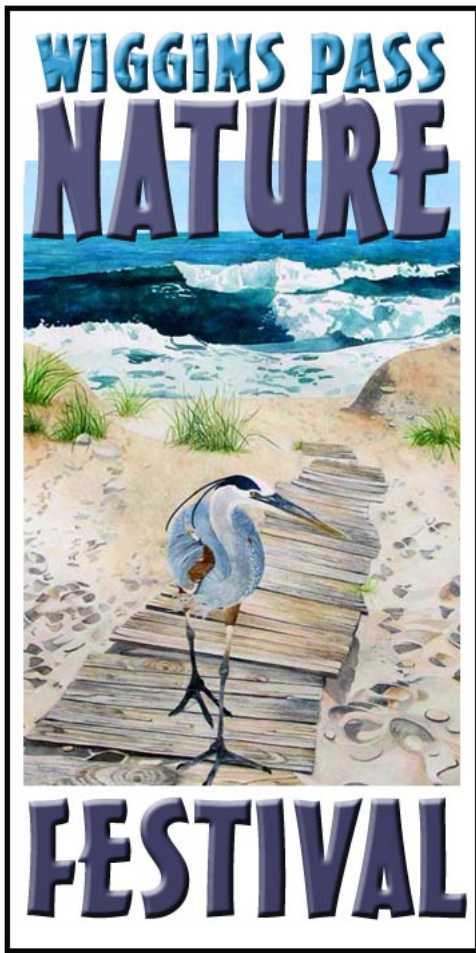
Our personal tour guide, Phil Nye. Phil has volunteered at Corkscrew Swamp Bird Sanctuary for 17 years.

How the Nature Festival Evolved

Delnor-Wiggins Pass State Park will once again hold the popular Wiggins Pass Nature Festival, on **March 19, 2011 from 10AM – 3 PM**. The event offers opportunities for adults and children to learn more about the environment and how to protect it, enjoy creating crafts from native materials, fish with a park ranger, and much more.

The first event of this type was associated with the National Parks, "March-for-Parks" in the year 1989. Participants pledged money for a 2-mile walk on the beach and in return could spend the day at the park. The National Parks provided event agendas and advertising for all parks who registered. All the proceeds stayed in the park to for use by the Supporters to enhance visitor services.

"A Celebration of the Outdoors" in 1997 was the first event in which other environmental agencies were invited. In 1998 the March-for-Parks became an "Ole Tyme Music Festival" with square dancers, banjos and Barbershop Quartets. This festival drew 3500 people and the event generated \$3,300. Earth Day, 2001, began with the March-For-Parks and offered environmental displays and programs about animals and insects that enjoy the park's coastal habitat. Millennium Kids, an organization promoting the protection of the Earth's wild places, provided support and educational materials for the Earth Day event.

Family Discovery Day was launched in 2006. Incorporating all the best of the previous events, Family Discovery Day opened up opportunities for more hands on participation. Adults and children could build sand sculptures, find and identify shells, learn how to fish by cast netting, create artistic masks from palm boots, and more.

Previously called the Supporters, the Friends of Delnor-Wiggins Pass State Park continued to sponsored this event to promote the use and enjoyment of the park for all ages. In 2010 the name was changed to The Wiggins Pass Nature Festival but the purpose of the event remained the same. This year the Festival will be held on March 19th from 10 to 3.

In summary this spring event has had its roots growing since 1989. "Hats Off" to the Friends of Delnor-Wiggins Pass State Park, who sponsor this event every March and continuously try to improve it. All proceeds go toward improvement of park facilities ultimately benefiting the public.
